### Four easy steps to becoming a Fairtrade shopper

- ◆ Buy Fairtrade certified products from the Traidcraft stall in the church hall after the morning service, normally on first and third Sunday mornings

All Traidcraft food and cotton items are Fairtrade certified. Paper goods are hand-made, recycled or from sustainable sources. On the stall you will also find some Just Trading Scotland products. Other non-certified goods on sale are produced applying Fairtrade criteria, although they do not carry the Fairtrade Mark.

## TRAIDCRAFT PLC

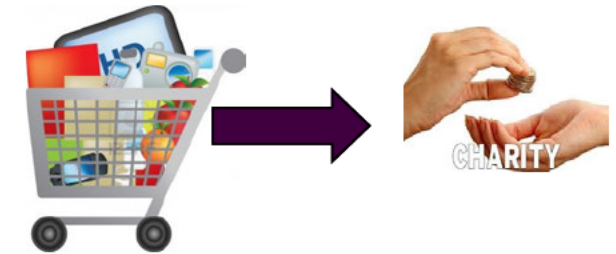
